DEPOSITS

Each registration must be accompanied by a deposit.

For **Adventure Day Camps: \$225** (50% of camp fees) for each 2-week session in which your child enrolls. The remaining balance must be paid two weeks prior to the start of each camp session. No camper will be allowed to attend any session until full payment is received.

TCS Outdoors: 50% of the camp fee is due as a non-refundable deposit for each program in which your child enrolls. The remaining balance must be paid two weeks prior to the start of each program. No camper will be allowed to attend any session until full payment is received.

ADVENTURE DAY CAMPS

Ages 4-11
Four 2-week Sessions

EARLY CHILDHOOD Ages 4-5 (4 by August 1, 2010)

The College School welcomes fully toilet-trained early childhood campers to join us for our themed day camps. Each two-week session will include daily on-campus activities, two swim lessons each week at Webster University, a once per week recreational swim at Webster Groves' Recreation Center's kiddies' pool and one or more theme-oriented off-campus field trips per week.

SHARING AND PREPARING June 7 - 18

This session will highlight the exciting adventure of working with friends. Camp activities will include cooking and other scientific experiments. Through communication and cooperation, the little inventors will prepare menus, create meals and explore science.

Field trips may include the Science Center and Cold Stone Creamery.

LOOK WHO IS BUZZING AROUND ST. LOUIS! June 21-July 2

In this session, the early childhood busy bees will be going on adventure hikes, playing cooperative games and exploring St. Louis. Arts and crafts and special projects will center on the Gateway City. When buzzing around town, they may visit the new St. Louis City Garden and the St. Louis Gateway Arch grounds and museum.

DISCOVERING THE WORLD WHEN I GROW UP Tuesday July 6-Friday, July 16 (NO CAMP Monday, 7/5 for holiday)

It is the roaring twenties - 2020's that is! Is there travel by airplane or do we beam ourselves around? Do we visit friends on other planets? Do people live in underwater habitats? We shall see when the early childhood soothsayers define their future.

Field trips may include the Zoo, Planet Fun and a walking field trip to Rocketship Park.

FAIRY TALES AND FANTASY July 19-30

During this session the children will explore Fairy Tales and Fantasy through books and make believe. Using their imaginations, the children will create their very own fantasy with their very own characters. Field trips may include The Butterfly House and St. Louis Carousel at Faust Park and The Magic House.

JUNIORS (Ages 6-7)

AROUND THE WORLD IN 10 DAYS June 7-18

Hop aboard and travel around the world with us during our first summer session! Children will explore a wide variety of international cultures through arts and crafts, music, storytelling, games, dance, food, and fun-filled adventures around St. Louis. Possible field trips

In each themed session, campers will enjoy exciting learning experiences, field trips and swimming. Day camps are led by experienced educators who are assisted by qualified and caring counselors.

Camps meet Monday through Friday, from 9 AM to 3 PM (except session three, which meets Tuesday-Friday during week one, because there is no camp on Monday, July 5 in observance of Independence Day). Before and after camp care is available from 7:30 to 9 AM and from 3 to 5:30 PM for an additional fee.

All camp sessions are \$450.

Fees include twice per week swim lessons at Webster University for Early Childhood and Junior Campers (not Seniors), plus recreational swim time at Webster Groves' Recreational Center's pool (once per week for Early Childhood and twice per week for Juniors and Seniors).

Each morning begins with games, exercises and activities. All campers work on balance and juggling and also in smaller groups focused on a wide variety of circus skills. Games, indoor/outdoor activities and challenges are enhanced by visits to the pool and field trips around the area. Campers present a final circus show to family, friends and peers on the last day of camp.

SCIENCE, ART & COOKING July 19-30

We'll investigate bugs one day, painting the next, and then kitchen concoctions. We will explore, discover and engage our brains the only way you can in the summer...with FUN! A visit from a real entomologist will help guide us as we create our own insect collection. A trip to Powder Valley will fuel our creativity for our

Walk about the wonders of our world-class city from downtown to Delmar, South Grand to Souldard, The Hill, Cherokee, the Central West End and Missouri Botanical Garden.
