AFTER CAMP CARE 3:00-5:30 PM, \$13 per day (\$5 per minute after 5:30 PM)

RED, WHITE & BLUE CAMP

For our camp families, the four-day Red, White & Blue Camp (July 2-6; no camp on July 4): Full payment of \$225 is needed.

DEPOSITS

A deposit must accompany each registration.

For Adventure Day Camps: \$225 for each twoweek session. The remaining balance must be paid two weeks prior to the start of each camp session. Full payment must be received in order for the camper to attend each session.

For Expeditions: 50% of the camp fee is due as a non-refundable deposit for each program in which your child enrolls. The remaining balance must be paid two weeks prior to the start of each program. Full payment must be received in order for the camper to attend each session. The deposit will be refunded if The College School cancels a program due to low enrollment.

Upon receipt of your registration and deposit, we will provide confirmation via email. Detailed camp information will be emailed prior to each camp session.

EARLY CHILDHOOD (AGES 4-6)

The College School welcomes fully toilet-trained campers (age 4 by August 1, 2018) to join us for our themed day camps. Weekly off-campus activities include swim lessons at Webster University, two supervised recreational swims at Webster Groves Recreation Complex, and a field trip.

SHOW-ME MISSOURI

Session 1 (June 4-15)

Discover the natural wonders of the state of Missouri! Through play and exploration, campers will learn about native plants and animals while visiting creeks, prairies, forests, ponds, and caves. Field trips may include the Jan Phillips Learning Center and Don Robinson State Park.

MAKING MAKERS

Session 2 (June 18-29)

Campers will explore different aspects of being a "maker" through building, tinkering, and creating. This session combines art, science, and engineering as campers explore the "maker" movement. Field trips may include a trip to the Science Center's Maker Garage and StL Teacher Recycle Center.

PICTURE PERFECT

Session 3 (July 9-20)

By investigating the wonderful world of photography, campers will become amateur photographers, taking their own photos and turning them into works of art. Campers will display works in gallery form at the end of camp. Field trips may include the Children's Illustrated Art Museum and Laumeier Sculpture Park.

SPLASH SCIENCE

Session 4 (July 23-August 3)

Campers will cool down and get wet through various water-based activities and experiments. Young scientists will dive deeper into understanding the watery world around them as they explore water in all forms. Field trips may include Myseum and Melvin Price Lock and Dam.

JUNIOR CAMPS (AGES 6-8)

Each week, off-campus activities include swim lessons at Webster University, recreational swims at the Webster Groves Recreation Complex, and a field trip.

IMAGINATION EXPLORATION

Session 1 (June 4-15)

Create your own fantasy world and bring it to life! Through stories, newspapers, movies, and costumes, campers will bring their fictional stories and characters to life through use of green-screen technology. Field trips may include a local news station and newsprint office.

INTERNATIONAL SPORTS ENTHUSIAST

Session 2 (June 18-29)

Practice global sports with area experts without needing a boarding pass! Learn about the origins of some of the most popular and more uncommon sports from around the world. Field trips may include St. Louis Bocce Club and Francis Park Handball.

ON THE SET: KIDS KITCHEN

Session 3 (July 9-20)

Fan of food TV, cooking competitions, or celebrity chefs? Using global foods, campers will expand their culinary skills while getting firsthand experience on the multi-faceted components of video production in making their very own cooking episode. Field trips may include the Companion Bakery Teaching Kitchen and a video editing/recording studio.

ANIMAL ALLIES

Session 4 (July 23-August 3)

From our pets to wild species, animals are all around us! Campers will learn why some animals are considered invasive, endangered, at-risk, and what people can do to be advocates for creatures. This camp has a strong service-learning emphasis; field trips may include visits to the World Bird Sanctuary and Lone Elk Park.

Senior Camps include recreational swims at the Webster Groves Recreation Complex and a field trip each week.

NATURE & SURVIVAL

Session 1 (June 4-15)

Set your adventurous spirit free while learning the important skills of survival. Whether a greenhorn or an experienced camper, activities range from plant identification and animal tracking basics to survival skills. Campers will gain confidence and comfort in being outdoors, while staying active. Field trips may include local conservation areas.

SOLO SPORTS EXTRAVAGANZA

Session 2 (June 18-29)

This summer, focus on staying active while sampling a variety of sports meant to be appreciated as an individual while having fun as a group. Spend time at both our 28-acre outdoor campus and in Webster Groves practicing archery, hiking, and indoor rock climbing. Field trips may include the Jan Phillips Learning Center and Climb SoiLL.

FLIGHT OF FANTASY

Session 3 (July 9-20)

Explore the world of magic and fantasy fiction through the Harry Potter series, The Hobbit, A Wrinkle in Time, and more fantasy books. Campers will make potions, scavenge the forest, act out skits, and take on the role of author in creating alternative endings or penning an original piece. Field trips may include area parks, as well as a fantasy fiction experience at The Den.

S.T.E.M. YOUR CREATIVITY

Session 4 (July 23-August 3)

Campers will engage in cooperative and competitive activities like catapult building, egg-drop challenge, and tallest towers. Coding and the use of Cubetto, Dash & Dot robots will create fun challenge courses for campers. Field trips will include a simulation day at Challenger Learning Center St. Louis.

RED, WHITE & BLUE WEEK (July 2 - 6; no camp on July 4) - Interim Session \$225

As a special service to our camp families, we offer a Preschool - Fifth Grade interim camp during the week of July 4th (July 2-6; no camp on July 4). Each day, we will plan age-appropriate activities for your campers such as arts and crafts, games, cooking projects, and celebrations. Examples of activities and projects are: rocket building, water balloon fun, sports, and games. We will have a classic Fourth of July picnic on the last day of camp. Before and after camp will continue to be available throughout this session.
